Dear Secretary Vilsack:

The State of Texas has been experiencing severe drought conditions, including above-normal temperatures and an extremely high number of wildfires for this time of year. Because of this critical situation, on February 24, 2009, I asked President Obama to approve an Emergency Declaration for 199 Texas counties in response to the extreme threat of wildfires throughout the state. Severe drought conditions have prompted local officials to issue burn bans in 205 counties.

The drought has created an economic emergency because of losses suffered by many farmers and ranchers. The farmers and ranchers were unable to control the cause of their economic and physical losses, which exceed state, local and private sector assistance capabilities.

In addition to other forms of assistance, these counties merit approval for the Federal Emergency Loan Program as a means of recovery for the agricultural producers.

On behalf of the farmers and ranchers of the enclosed listed counties, I request that you designate all 254 counties in the State of Texas disaster areas for 2009 for the purpose of making available emergency loans or other appropriate relief for physical and economic losses to aid in overcoming this disaster.
