The Texas Legislature is set to reconvene in January, 2021, and this will really be a unique setting. After a decade of increased revenue, this biennium will be much different. Over the past year Covid 19 has had its effects on our state economy. We have experienced lower oil and gas revenue, lower sales tax income and decreased state licensing and fee dollars. Soon legislators will be scrambling to find income to keep the state agencies running smoothly.

There will be zero dollars for new programs and most agencies will be told to decrease spending by 10 - 15%. Fewer new hires and trimmed down budgets will be the marching orders for all agencies. The Texas Department of Health will be the only department to have a chance for more money. Our representatives and senators will be scouring the state economy to find new sources of tax and fee revenue. Many of the new urban legislators will be looking at the tax exemptions enjoyed by agriculture and also giving county governments some of the previous state duties (unfunded mandates).
